Transition Assistance Management Program (TAMP)

What is the Transition Assistance Management Program?

The Transition Assistance Management Program (TAMP) provides career/employment assistance, vocational guidance, and transition information to separating Marines and their family members. The tools and information provided enable all separating Marines and their family members to make an effective transition from military to civilian life. Separating Marines are counseled and advised of the availability of these programs and their responsibility for attending at their last duty assignment prior to leaving the military.

Where can I find transition services?

Transition services and resources are provided in the Career Resource Management Center at each installation.

Who is eligible?

Transition services are available to all Marines and their family members who are within 12 months of separation or within 24 months of retirement. On a space-available basis, separated Marines can attend workshops up to 180 days after their date of separation. Pre-separation counseling is mandatory for all separating Marines and Transition Assistance Program (TAP) workshops shall be attended as well.

What are the services of the program?

Services include workshops, counseling, assessments, and seminars

- Mandatory pre-separation counseling
- Transition Assistance Program Workshops
- Employment and training assistance
- Individual Transition Plan
- Career assessment
- Financial planning
- Instruction in resume preparation, cover letter and job applications
- Job analysis techniques
- Job search techniques and preparation
- Interview techniques
- Information on Federal, State, and local programs providing assistance
- Veteran's benefits
- Disabled Transition Assistance program
- Verification of Military Experience and Training (VMET) Form (DD-Form 2568)
