Spouse Ambassador Network

The Spouse Ambassador Network is a committed group of organizations within MSEP that have community networks and will leverage these networks to broaden knowledge about military spouse career resources in communities where military spouses live and work. The network creates awareness about the challenges related to military spouse employment and work with community organizations to increase military spouse career opportunities and advancement.

Spouse Ambassador Network

Military Spouses are highly skilled and dedicated employees in the American workforce. Of the 700,000 plus active-duty military spouses, more than 50 percent are 31 years old or younger¹. They are tech-savvy, more educated than their civilian counterparts and are resilient and adaptable as they live the mobile military life. Military families relocate, on average, every two to three years, meaning military spouses are often unable to maintain their employment status or establish career tenure, resulting in a 25 percent unemployment rate² and 25 percent wage gap³. These employment setbacks adversely affect the readiness, retention and well-being of the military community.

Members of the Spouse Ambassador Network are part of a like-minded community of organizations that belong to and support the mission of MSEP. The partnership connects military spouses with more than 220 partner employers who have pledged to recruit, hire, promote and retain military spouses in portable careers. This partnership helps military spouses find employment, build on their education and experience and achieve their career and personal goals.



As a Department of Defense Spouse Education and Career Opportunities initiative, the mission of the Spouse Ambassador Network is to educate, empower and mentor military spouses to encourage career fulfillment by promoting and sharing resources while facilitating effective relationships with local and national stakeholders.
