

Keesler Air Force Base is located within the city limits of Biloxi, Miss, on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. The host unit, the 81st Training Wing, is the electronics training Center of Excellence for the U. S. Air Force. 81TRW also hosts the 2nd Air Force, 403rd Wing (Hurricane Hunters) as well as the 2nd largest Air Force medical treatment facility in the U.S., the Keesler Medical Center. Keesler's training center handles 40,000 students annually, in 500 courses, with an average daily student load of over 4,000. In its status as a lead joint training installation, Keesler trains not only Air Force, but Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and other military and civilian federal agency personnel.

### **About Us**

Airman and Family Readiness Center (A&FRC) offers a wide variety of services available for all service members and their families. The merger of Services and Mission Support Squadron to Force Support Squadron added Casualty and SBP to our center. A Program Manager is assigned and oversees the operations of each program.

### **Relocation Assistance Services:**

Inbound Services include: Child Care for PCS, Lending Locker, Individual Relocation Consultations, Community School Information, Newcomer Welcome packages, Newcomers Orientation Sponsor Training, and a Spouses Tour for newcomers.

### Family Readiness Program:

<u>Operation Hero</u>: Semi-quarterly program focusing on deployment related issues. Spouse and children experience a deployment line setting where they learn about military deployments and the programs available to them while their loved one is gone.

<u>Hearts Apart Program</u>: One 15-minute morale phone call per week between family members and deployed individuals.

<u>Phone Home Program</u>: Calling cards donated by the Air Force Aid Society (AFAS.) These are provided to deployed members and significant others.

<u>Video Telephone</u>: A spouse can sign out a video telephone for a one-week timeframe.

<u>Digital Cameras/Digital Camcorders</u>: Available for check-out anytime. Digital photos can be turned into iron-on transfers for pillowcase/T-shirt or calendar.

Monthly Deployed Family Group Outing: Support group for deployed families.

#### Air Force Aid:

AFAS is a non-profit organization that assists the Air Force family in three broad areas: education grants, community programs and interest-free loans. Interest-free loans are made on a case-by-case basis for basic living needs. Community programs include Bundles for Babies, Give Parents a Break, Respite Care, Car Care Because We Care, and the Childcare for PCS or Childcare for Volunteers programs. The Society also supports the Youth Employment Skills volunteer program coordinated by the Youth Activities Center for high school students, allowing them to 'bank' funds to use for college!

Annually, the applications for the Hap Arnold Education Grant become available on line. These forms are completed by the individual, usually due by mid-March, to compete for \$2,000.

### **Transition Assistance Program:**

<u>Annual Spring Southern Region Military and Civilian Job Fair</u> -- Largest job fair in the Southeastern region.

<u>Transition workshop:</u> Three-day workshop held monthly to educate individuals preparing to separate from the military.

Executive Transition workshop: Scheduled Sep 8-11, 2008

<u>Veterans' workshop</u>: One-day workshop held in conjunction with transition. This workshop educates members on the benefits and programs available to them.

Transition Employment Opportunities Public Folder-more than 900 jobs listed for easy access.

<u>Retirement Benefits Overview Briefing</u> – Educates individuals on entitlements available to them and their families as retired military members.

<u>Wounded Warrior</u> (previously known as Palace HART) – CRC assigned to individual; followed up to 5 years

<u>Disabled American Veterans (DAV)</u> – offer one-on-one counseling and reviews claims

### **Career Focus Program:**

<u>Job Search classes</u>: Prepares spouses and family members to excel at finding employment or starting their own business.

<u>Guide to Gulf Coast Employment</u>. Pamphlet with scores of local businesses, includes web sites/email addresses/locations for a variety of industries. Assists newcomers in job search.

<u>Air Force Aid Society Grant-Funded Classes</u>. Annually, apply for funding for employment education classes to give spouses better job skills. Have been successful for more than five years in receiving funds - \$5K+ for office practices, MICROSOFT suite courses, medical billing & coding, and certified nursing assistant are trainings which have been offered to approximately 30 spouses annually.

Resume' review. Individual consultation to provide guidance on preparing résumé's.

On-base employer 'fairs.' Invite employers & employment agencies, on base for a day to meet military spouses and family members, explore job opportunities & take applications on the spot.

Military Spouse Virtual Assistant course: Help spouses find ways to work over the internet, fax, and email – portable careers to operate world-wide! 'Graduates' receive special access to job offers through the Staff Centrix company at no cost.
