WELCOME to Eglin Air Force Base, located on Florida's Gulf Coast and home to the most beautiful beaches in the world. As the School Liaison Officer, I am here to help with the educational concerns of your school-age children. Eglin AFB is located in Okaloosa County, and our local school district is the Okaloosa County School District. Surrounding counties are Santa Rosa and Walton County. We have an excellent relationship with the local school districts, surrounding school districts and their communities.

The School Liaison Officer is the point of contact between the military installation, school administration, parents and the community as a whole. Primary responsibilities include advising the military command on all matters concerning student education and school operations, fostering a responsive and cooperative relationship between local school districts and the military community, and assisting military families with education matters that are unique to the military lifestyle such as school transitions, frequent moves, deployment, and education inconsistencies that exist from state-to-state.

The goal of the School Liaison Officer is to empower parents to be their child's best advocate in the education process and to help parents navigate the school system and "level the playing field' for military families by ensuring that military children are given the opportunities to achieve their highest potential at any assigned location.

The commitment of Eglin AFB to the community and to school-age education is very strong, and we ask for your help in expanding this relationship. We encourage you to take an active role in volunteering at the schools your children attend. Parental involvement is key to a positive school experience.

If you live on Eglin AFB, Eglin Elementary is your zoned school. If you work on Eglin AFB, you can request a waiver to allow your child to attend Eglin Elementary.

The benefits of your child attending Eglin Elementary are many; to include having your child close by during your work day thus allowing you to be more involved in your child's education and after school activities. The Eglin Before And After School Program and Child Development Centers are located next to Eglin Elementary and bus transportation is provided to these locations through the before and after school programs.

EGLIN AFB BEFORE-AND-AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Before-and-After School Program and Summer Day Camp provide recreational/leisure skill programs-dramatic arts, sewing, cooking, jewelry making, sports and video games; academic assistance, computers, books & research materials, and mentors. Their mission is to provide growth and development of school-age children through their out-of-school experiences. They provide a safe, supervised, healthy and age appropriate environment, thus enabling the Eglin community to accomplish their mission. The 36,000 square foot, world–class School Age facility was built adjacent to the Youth Center and includes 21 state-of-the-art classrooms. In addition, there is a stage area and section designed for indoor physical activity, as well as enclosed outdoor play areas. The Before-and-After School staff strives to help your children build a strong self-concept; develop self-reliance; and develop an increased curiosity for learning. This program runs before and after school and provides full day care during the summer.

CHECKLIST FOR SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

Special Education

Special Education is referred to as Exceptional Student Education (ESE) in Florida. When you move to a new school system with an Individual Education Plan (IEP), the new school must provide comparable special education services until the current IEP is adopted or a new one is written. In order to expedite services, you may want to contact and fax your child's IEP to the respective District ESE coordinator. Keep in mind, the Local Education Agency (LEA) may require additional paperwork specific to that district.

Be Sure to Hand Carry the Following:

- 3. Child's Military ID Card
- 4. Immunization Records
- 5. Report Cards
- 6. Copy of School Transcript
- 7. IEPs
- 8. Any assessments or evaluations

- 10. English as a Second Language (ESL) or Bilingual Education
- 11. Section 504 Plan

FEDERAL IMPACT AID

Many local school districts across the United States include within their boundaries, parcels of land that are owned by the Federal Government. These school districts face special challenges: They must provide a quality education to the children and meet the requirements of the ESEA while sometimes operating with less local revenue than is available to other school districts because the Federal property is exempt from local property taxes. Impact aid was designed to assist these local school districts that have lost property tax revenue or that have experienced increased expenditures due to the enrollment of federally connected children, including military children.

Impact Aid, among the largest programs under the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education, is a federal formula grant program designed to relieve the financial burden placed on resources of local education agencies in educating significant numbers of federally connected students – those who reside on military bases, low-rent housing properties, Indian lands or other federal properties, and/or have parents in the uniformed services or employed on eligible federal properties.

For schools that qualify, funds from the Impact Aid program are sent directly to the school district. Funds are generally placed into a school district's general fund to pay for the purchase of textbooks, computers, maintenance, and to offset the cost of staff salaries.

Please ensure you fill out the Federal Impact Aid card that your school sends home to you in the Oct timeframe. It is imperative that this form be filled our correctly and returned to your child's school in a timely manner so these funds can be allocated to your child's school district.
