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

# Welcome to Scott Air Force Base



Welcome to the start of a new school year. We look forward to getting the 2009/2010 school year off to a great start. If you're new to Scott AFB, congratulations and welcome.

Scott AFB is a superb place for families. In addition to great amenities and recreational facilities found on the installation, our location offers unlimited points of interest in the surrounding communities and local schools committed to providing a quality education for our children. As School Liaison Officer, my role is to improve transitional support for school age children of Scott AFB personnel by establishing partnerships between the base and local schools, advocating for military children, increasing awareness of the unique needs of military children, and providing a process to address and resolve military specific issues affecting students in kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

There are many school systems serving Scott AFB. Main base housing residents attend Mascoutah Schools, with four schools and approximately 2,900 students. Scott Elementary School, which serves students living on base in grades Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade, is located right next to the base near the Scott AFB Youth and Teen Center. Mascoutah Elementary (also serving students in grades Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade) and Mascoutah Middle School (serving students in grades 6-8) are located just eight miles away from the base on Sixth Street in Mascoutah. Mascoutah High School is located just eight miles away from the base on West Main Street.

There are many additional educational options available in the Scott AFB area. For those living off-base there are opportunities for Scott families to attend schools in nearby cities: Belleville, Fairview Heights, Lebanon, O'Fallon, Shiloh, and nearby counties, Madison, Monroe, and Randolph. There is also an extensive listing of private schools in the area from which you can choose.

We have a superb relationship with the school districts. Our commitment as a member of the surrounding school districts/communities is very strong—we will need your help to continue to expand this relationship to help improve our schools. Please consider volunteering in your children's schools.

This brochure is divided up in three sections. The first is an alphabetized list of general information you should know about. All the web sites for local school districts are next. Specific information for Mascoutah, Belleville, and O'Fallon school districts follows.

## General Information

### *Book Fees*

Many parents question the charging of book and activity fees by school districts and why school district charge these fees even though families pay taxes or districts receive Impact Aid in lieu of taxes. These fees are allowed by law and must be paid. Illinois courts have viewed student fees as separate from tuition. Court cases have upheld individual school board's rights to establish fee levels for various grades and student activities. The court's reasoning was the early acts, which addressed public funding of education, made no requirement for schools to furnish textbooks at public expense. In yet another case, the court held that a school, even though it may furnish free textbooks, can charge student fees for supplies. The Illinois School Code requires districts to have a policy for waiving fees for students who cannot afford to pay.

### ***Bus Locator***

All bus stops are determined by each individual school district. Please make sure your school has your child's correct address and contact the Director of Transportation for the school district if you have bus issues.

### ***Delayed Openings – Early Closure***

The superintendent of each school district makes the decision to close schools. After receiving information and recommendations from the Director of School Transportation, and considering the time and severity of the inclement weather, the Superintendent makes a decision usually no later than 0700 for schools to close, delay opening for two hours, or to open under regular schedule. Delayed opening decisions will be aired on local news channels, television stations, posted on the school district website.

### ***High School Graduation Requirements***

Any student who enters high school will have to take the following minimum number of courses during high school:

- 4 years of language arts; 2 years of writing-intensive courses, one year of which must be offered as an English language arts course and may be counted toward meeting one year of the four-year English language arts requirement. The writing courses may be counted toward the fulfillment of other state graduation requirements, when applicable, if writing-intensive content is provided in a subject area other than English language arts;
- 3 years of mathematics, one of which must be Algebra 1 and one of which must include geometry content;
- 2 years of science;
- 2 years of social studies, of which at least one year must be the history of the United States or a combination of the history of the United States and American government;
- 1 year chosen from any of the following:
  - art;
  - music;
  - foreign language, which shall include American Sign Language; and
  - vocational education.

### ***Home Schooling***

Parents may elect to participate in Home Instruction in a number of ways. All parents using either of the options below should complete and submit a Notice of Intent to Provide Home Instruction.

Contact your school district office for appropriate forms. The Illinois State Board of Education website also includes home instruction information for parents, available for download at the following website: <http://www.isbe.state.il.us/homeschool/default.htm>. There is a group of parents at Scott AFB who home school. If you would like to find out more information about how to join this group in its activities, please contact the Scott AFB School Liaison Officer.

### ***Illinois Learning Standards***

The Illinois Learning Standards (ILS) defines what students in all Illinois public schools should know and be able to do in the seven core areas as a result of their elementary and secondary schooling. Illinois requires the mandated use of Illinois Learning Standards and the associated testing by the Illinois State Achievement Test (ISAT) at the elementary level and Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE), American College Testing (ACT) and other standardized testing at the high school level to include WorkKeys. Illinois adopted these standards and testing to measure student progress, and to meet requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act. Illinois Learning Standards emphasize the importance of instruction in English, Math, Science, and History. All students, including transfer students, are required to take these tests in grades 3, 5, 8, and throughout High School. There is no current requirement for minimum scoring associated with being able to receive an Illinois diploma.

You may view your school's tests results by visiting either the school district or individual school website. Also, the Illinois State Department of Education website provides a "School Report Card" for each school in Illinois which includes information on test results. ### ***Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy***

The internationally recognized Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy® (IMSA) is located in Aurora, Illinois. Its purpose is to develop creative, ethical leaders in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. As a teaching and learning laboratory created by the State of Illinois, IMSA enrolls academically talented Illinois students (grades 10-12) in its advanced, residential college preparatory program, and it serves thousands of educators and students in Illinois and beyond through innovative instructional programs that foster imagination and inquiry. ### ***Immunizations***

Upon entry or transfer into a school setting, documented proof of immunization is required, as listed below.

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, & Pertussis (DTaP or DTP) – Minimum of three doses. A child must have at least one dose of DTaP or DTP vaccine after the fourth birthday. DT (Diphtheria, Tetanus) vaccine is required for children who are medically exempt from the pertussis containing vaccine (DTap) or

DTP). Adult tetanus and diphtheria is required for children 7 years of age and older who do not meet the minimum requirements for tetanus and diphtheria.

- ☑ Polio Vaccine – A minimum of three doses of polio vaccine with one dose administered after the fourth birthday. However, a child who has received four doses of polio vaccine before the fourth birthday is adequately immunized and does not need a dose after the fourth birthday.
- ☑ Measles, Mumps, & Rubella (MMR) – A minimum of two measles, one mumps, and one rubella. First dose must be administered on or after the first birthday. Second dose of measles vaccine does not have to be administered until age 4-6 years (usually at entry to kindergarten).
- ☑ Hib Vaccine – Influenza vaccine required only for children by 30 months of age administered as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics.
- ☑ Hepatitis B – Three doses required for all children born on and after 1 Jan 1994 (with at least four months spacing between the first and third doses).
- ☑ Varicella – All susceptible children born on or after 1 Jan 1997 will be required to have one dose of chicken pox vaccine not earlier than 12 months of age.

## ***Impact Aid***

Since 1950, Congress has provided financial assistance to local school districts through the Department of Education Impact Aid Program. Impact Aid was designed to assist local school districts that lost property tax revenue due to the presence of tax-exempt Federal property, or that have experienced increased expenditures due to the enrollment of federally connected children. At the beginning of each school year, your child's school will send home a federal survey card to be completed by a parent or guardian. It is important for you to fill out these forms as they are tied to monies for your child's school.

## ***Key and Essential Personnel School Provision***

The Illinois School Code now allows families who were formerly living off base but who are forced to move on base due to military orders into a key and essential billet to continue sending their children to the school district they were originally attending for the duration of their orders as long as the family provides transportation to and from the original attendance center. Special School Code verbiage follows:

- 105 ILCS 5/10-20.12b) (a-5) If a pupil's change of residence is due to the military service obligation of a person who has legal custody of the pupil, then, upon the written request of the person having legal custody of the pupil, the residence of the pupil is deemed for all purposes relating to enrollment (including tuition, fees, and costs), for the duration of the custodian's military service obligation, to be the same as the residence of the pupil immediately before the change of residence caused by the military service obligation. A school district is not responsible for providing transportation to or from school for a pupil whose residence is determined under this subsection (a-5). School districts shall facilitate re-enrollment when necessary to comply with this subsection (a-5).

## ***New Student Registrations***

Most school districts require the following documents at the time of registration.

- ☑ Student's original certificate of birth or certified copy
- ☑ Record of immunization: See additional information below.

- ☑ Document of recent physical completed by any doctor in any location BUT must be on the State of Illinois Department of Human Services Certificate of Child Health Examination Form: Illinois School Entrance Health Forms may be picked up at any school, or downloaded from <http://www.mascoutah19.k12.il.us/district/reg/StudentPhysicalForm.pdf>
- Document of Dental Exam: The Illinois Department of Health School Dental Physical Form can be picked up at any school or downloaded from <http://www.idph.state.il.us/HealthWellness/oralhlth/DentalExamProof.pdf>
- Proof of Eye Examination: The required State of Illinois Proof of Eye Examination form can be picked up from any school or downloaded from <http://www.mascoutah19.k12.il.us/district/reg/EyeExamReport.pdf>
- ☑ Legal proof of residence: Letter from housing, settlement or rental contract, utility bill, etc.
- ☑ Student's Social Security Card
- ☑ IEP: Individual Education Plan for student with special needs/disability (best if evaluations are current within past 12-months)
- ☑ Legal Documents: As needed (court custody, adoption, foster, etc.)
- ☑ Records from previous school: Or, the correct address for request of records (recommend you hand carry records from previous school)

*Note: In Illinois, students entering Kindergarten must have reached their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before 1 September of the year in which they enroll.*

## **Parent Teacher Association (PTA)**

Schools are happy to have committed parents helping facilitate the education of children. Many schools have PTAs; contact your child's school to determine time/location. If your school does not have a PTA, why not start one yourself?

## **School District Requirements**

School requirements and policies are not the same from district to district. Each district is obligated to meet State requirements for students learning standards for all students. These requirements change from State to State and often put our transitioning students in jeopardy of graduating on time. We are available to help you with tips on preparing your child for transitioning from school to school.

## **School Locator**

Your address determines which elementary, middle, or high school your child will attend. If you choose to live on base the following schools will serve your children:

- Register at Scott Elementary School if you have children in grades K-5 students.
- Register at Mascoutah Middle School if you have children in grades 6-8.
- Register at Mascoutah High School if you have children in grades 9-12.

Whether you are just temporarily living on base or if you secure permanent housing on base, your child may be enrolled in the Mascoutah School District. If you live on base temporarily but then secure off-base housing, your child may either continue to attend school in the Mascoutah School

District for the current school year or you may enroll your child in the district that serves your permanent residence.

Should you decide to live off-base, the Illinois School Code now allows you to register your child in the school district in which you intend to live without having to pay out of district tuition, as long as you can prove that you will live in that school district within 60 days of arrival. Bring a copy of your military orders along with proof of residency to the school district in which your intended residence is located along with the other required registration documents in order to register your child.

## ***Special Education***

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Illinois' special education law require all schools to ensure that all identified children with disabilities have the right to a free, appropriate public education. Special Education and related services are provided at no cost to identified disabled students, ages 2-21. Services are available at each school for the diagnosis and remediation of learning difficulties. Begin the evaluation process with the school district in which you reside. The majority of students eligible for special education services receive them in their school district. Students in need of more intensive services may receive support in a program outside the school. It is best to contact your school principal or the Director of Special Education/Student Services, or the Special Education Advisory Committee for additional information and referral procedures. If you are new to a school district, it is suggested that you update your child's IEP within two months. This will help your child receive services that are available in the local school district.

## ***Standards of Learning Tests***

Illinois uses the Illinois Skills Achievement Test (ISAT) for students in grades 3-8 to provide educators and the public with valuable information regarding the progress of Illinois students toward mastering Illinois reading, writing and mathematics standards. For high school age students, the Prairie State Achievement and ACT scores are used to measure student and school success.
