Education and Careers

- Key to Military Family Life Goals
 - Buy a home
 - Send kids to college
 - Career aspirations
- Major contribution to military family financial well-being
 - A second income/career while husband/wife in service to the nation
 - 77% of spouses desire to work
 - 89% want to develop a career



Families Also Serve



Education and Training

- A High Priority for Military Spouses
- Research says:
 - 87% report education/training is a personal goal**
 - 51% would like to be enrolled in post-secondary schooling (20% currently enrolled)
 - 75% cite cost of education as reason not in school
 - 54% report training would have helped during their last relocation

Spousal support a major predictor of reenlistment

Employment Challenges

- Challenges for military spouses
 - Unemployment rate for military spouses is 12%
 - Military spouses earn \$3 per hour less than civilian look-alikes
 - 27% could have used financial help with transferring certifications (nursing, teaching, real estate, etc.) during last relocation
 - Often not resident of state where assigned
 - Not uniformly eligible for in-state tuition or unemployment compensation





Spouse Employment Overview

Approximately 71 percent of enlisted spouses and 61 percent of officer spouses are employed or are seeking employment. Reasons for employment range from financial necessity to personal fulfillment or independence. Regardless of employment status, military spouses cite the following challenges when considering employment:

- co-parenting issues when the active duty spouse is on extended deployment or works for long-hours
- child care difficulties
- local labor market conditions
- frequent and disruptive moves
- employer bias
- continuing education

Military leaders can help families successfully navigate these challenges by ensuring that Service members and their spouses are aware of and have access to military support systems. The DoD recognizes that in today's all volunteer force, assisting military spouses to adjust to and thrive within the military community is of paramount importance. Many initiatives are underway to assist the military spouse. DoD and the Services are increasing the capacity of quality child care and developing web-based resources to assist spouses regardless of their location.

Fortunately, whether leaders are in a deployed environment or are in garrison, there are spousal employment resources specifically designed to assist them in their role as leaders and to provide employment support services directly to military spouses.

Military leaders can assist in the distribution of critical and timely information through their unit sponsorship programs, indoctrinations, and unit and command level briefs. It is strongly encouraged that military leaders take every opportunity to ensure that their troops and community members are aware of available resources designed to assist a job-seeking spouse.
