2022 EFMP Survey Results





The 2022 Exceptional Family Member Program Survey, sponsored by the Defense Department, was fielded from November 2022 to March 2023 to assess the experience of military families as they navigate EFMP. Approximately 100,000 active-duty service members enrolled in EFMP were invited to complete the web-based survey. The results represent active-duty members who have (or had) a dependent enrolled in EFMP.

The Office of Special Needs values input from families enrolled in EFMP. The findings from the first DOD-wide EFMP survey will inform program enhancements and further standardization efforts.


