### What other help is available?

Your installation's <u>Family Advocacy</u> <u>Program</u> can help you:

- Develop a safety plan for you and your family
- Find a safe house or shelter
- Access counseling
- Arrange for a medical exam or court appearance
- Find additional military and civilian resources

# Transitional Compensation: Financial Support for Victims of Abuse

#### What is transitional compensation?

Transitional compensation is a 12- to 36-month resource that provides financial support and other resources to dependent victims of abuse. If you are a military spouse, dependent child, or an active-duty service member spouse, you may be eligible for this benefit if:

- You were married to the abusive service member at the time of the abuse
- Your service member was convicted of a dependent-abuse offense; or
- Your service member was separated from the military under a courtmartial sentence; sentenced to a forfeiture of all pay and allowances by a court-martial for a dependent-abuse offense; or administratively separated, at least in part, for a dependent-abuse offense\*

\*If abuse occurred, and the service member wasn't separated for an abuse offense, you may still be eligible for this resource. Contact a <u>domestic abuse</u> victim advocate to learn more.

The resource may include:

- Medical care
- Exchange privileges
- Commissary privileges

The <u>resource amount</u> is based on Dependency and Indemnity Compensation, which changes annually. To maintain eligibility, you cannot remarry or move back in with the former service member while receiving benefits, and you must recertify annually.
