



Options for Reporting Domestic Abuse

If you're in immediate danger, call 911. If your partner's behavior makes you feel threatened or unsafe, whether in person or online, you have options to report the behavior and get help.



RESTRICTED REPORTING PRESERVES PRIVACY AND LIMITS WHO'S INVOLVED

Use this option only when there is no immediate risk of physical danger.

- Make a restricted report to a:
 - ☐ Medical or mental health care provider
 - ☐ Family Advocacy Program staff member
 - ☐ Domestic abuse victim advocate
- Keep the report confidential — law enforcement is not involved.
- FAP does not forward the report to command.
- Receive access to services, including medical care, victim advocacy support and counseling, **while maintaining your privacy.**

REPORTS TO OTHER ENTITIES ARE NOT RESTRICTED AND MAY TRIGGER COMMAND OR LAW ENFORCEMENT'S NOTIFICATION AND INVOLVEMENT.

* Your safety is our top priority. While confidential reporting options exist for domestic abuse, situations involving imminent risk of harm could trigger an unrestricted report.



UNRESTRICTED REPORTING COMMAND AND LAW ENFORCEMENT INVOLVED

CALL 911 IF YOU ARE IN IMMEDIATE DANGER.

- Make an unrestricted report to:
 - ☐ Command
 - ☐ Military law enforcement
 - ☐ Family Advocacy Program staff member
 - ☐ Domestic abuse victim advocate (your first point of contact)
- Understand that the report is not confidential — military law enforcement may investigate and contact the person who caused you harm.
- Engage command, which can provide protection, including a military protection order.
- Receive full access to services, including medical care, support from a victim advocate and counseling services.

ALL REPORTS OF CHILD ABUSE ARE UNRESTRICTED.
