Across the Department of Defense, there are 888,892¹ children of active duty members.

67%

of active duty spouses have a child under 18 living at home.

For some questions, spouses were allowed to mark more than one option, and therefore, the sum of options does not equal 100%. For example, spouses with multiple children may have indicated children in multiple age groups. Where percentages do not sum to 100%, only the affirmative response is shown. For example, not all spouses with children living at home ages 2-17 have a child attending a school listed.



Reasons for Not Using Child Care


