



The Defense Department provides military funeral honors to express deep gratitude for those who have served our nation. The following individuals are eligible to receive military funeral honors – at no cost:

- Military members who die while on active duty
- Eligible veterans, former members of the selected reserves, Members of the Commissioned Officers Corps of the Public Health Service and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, certain eligible civilian or contractual groups who have been given active-duty determinations

It is our nation's way of saying to the family of the departed – their loved one is not forgotten – we will take them home.

Funeral providers: We are here to serve – and to help you serve – the family of any eligible veteran.

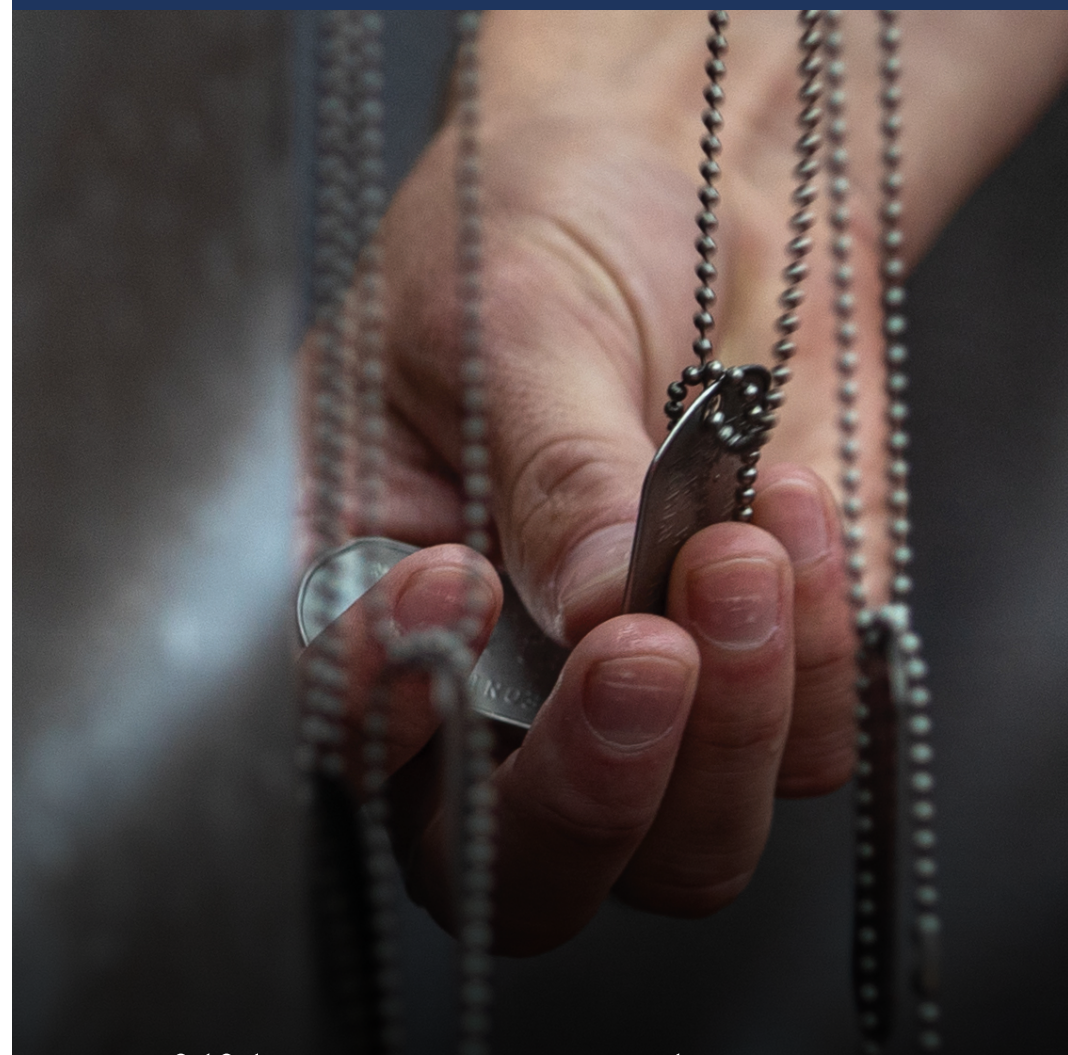
