Medical transcriptionists (MTs) are specialists in medical language and healthcare documentation.

Workforce development is essential to ensure that documentation experts are in place to assist the industry in transitioning to an electronic health record and to preserve the quality & integrity of future health records.

Graduates of selected medical transcription training programs who earn the Registered Medical Transcriptionist (RMT) credential are candidates to participate in the new federally approved Registered Apprenticeship Program. This program, sponsored by the American Association for Medical Transcription (AAMT) and the Medical Transcription Industry Association (MTIA) offers structured, on-the-job learning, and related technical instruction for qualified MTs entering the profession.

What is an MT?

Medical transcriptionists translate from oral to written form the record of a patient's medical history, diagnosis, treatment, prognosis and outcome. Physicians and other providers employ state-of-the-art technology to dictate this information and then rely on medical transcriptionists to transform their spoken words into comprehensive records that accurately communicate clinical information.

ACCP-approved schools provide state-of-the-art education enabling each MT graduate to deliver accurately transcribed documents for healthcare providers.
