



The following established style guidelines reflect the long-standing practices of developers and editors of content for MilLife Learning. They are consistent with the rules and guidance outlined in The Associated Press Stylebook and reflective of Office of Military Community and Family Policy style and usage preferences.

Content Tips

- Write in a way that doesn't assume the reader is either male or female. Keep it neutral.
- Write in relationship-neutral terms, such as "partner" or "couple."
- Keep the wide audience range in mind.
- Make connections from what the course offers to the intended audience's needs.
- Write a call-to-action statement in course descriptions.
- Use an action verb to start rotating panel and module content.

Things to Avoid

- Make assumptions.
- Tell people how they feel.
- Tell people what they should/need to/must/ought to/can't/won't do.
- Tell people what they should always/never do.
